Richard, Marquis Wellesley, was the oldest brother of the first Duke of Wellington. He was Governor General of India from 1797 to 1805, British ambassador extraordinary to Spain in 1809, and subsequently Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs (1809-12) and Lord Lieutenant of Ireland (1821-8, 1833-4).

These papers were bequeathed by Sir Victor Wellesley to the seventh Duke of Wellington in 1954.
