## Research experience:

My research programme spans more than 30 years and includes more than 12 clinical trials three Cochrane reviews, the development of three tools and two products and has attracted more than £10 million in peer-reviewed funding (more than £5 million as PI).

I currently lead a team of staff focusing on:

- Evaluating existing continence products and urinary catheters to provide users and health professionals with evidence on which to base cost-effective choices
- Using data from evaluations to design and test better products
- Developing tools to measure continence product performance
- Studying the effects of continence products on health in particular skin health and urinary tract infection.
- Influencing policy on the provision. The development and delivery of my research involves strong patient/user partnerships with representation at all levels from grant development through to implementation, dissemination and impact.
