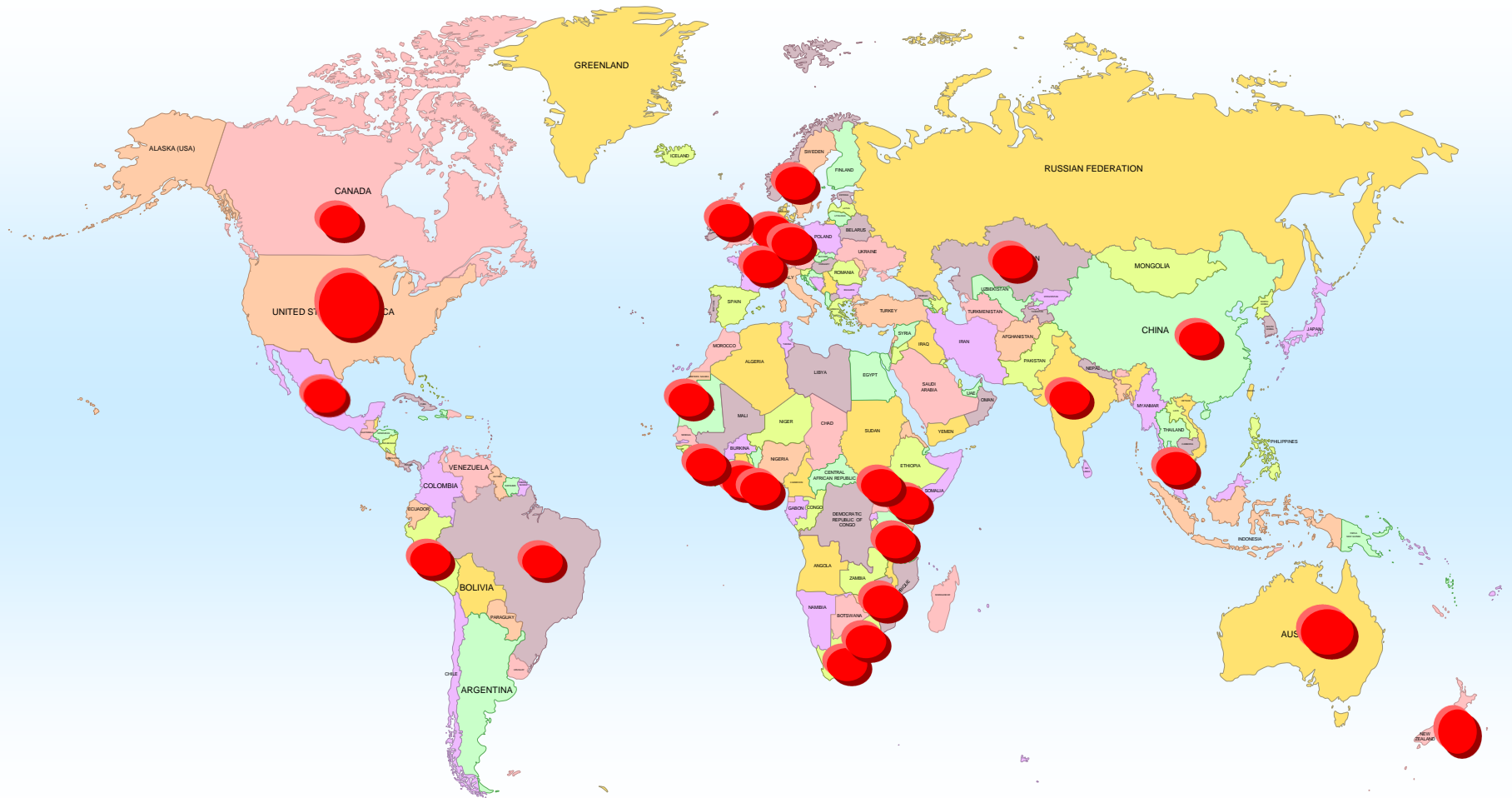
Global Health

- Examines cost-effective and sustainable solutions and best practice interventions to reduce the global burden of disease
- Includes both communicable and non-communicable conditions and applies to populations anywhere

The Global Health Research Institute at Soton

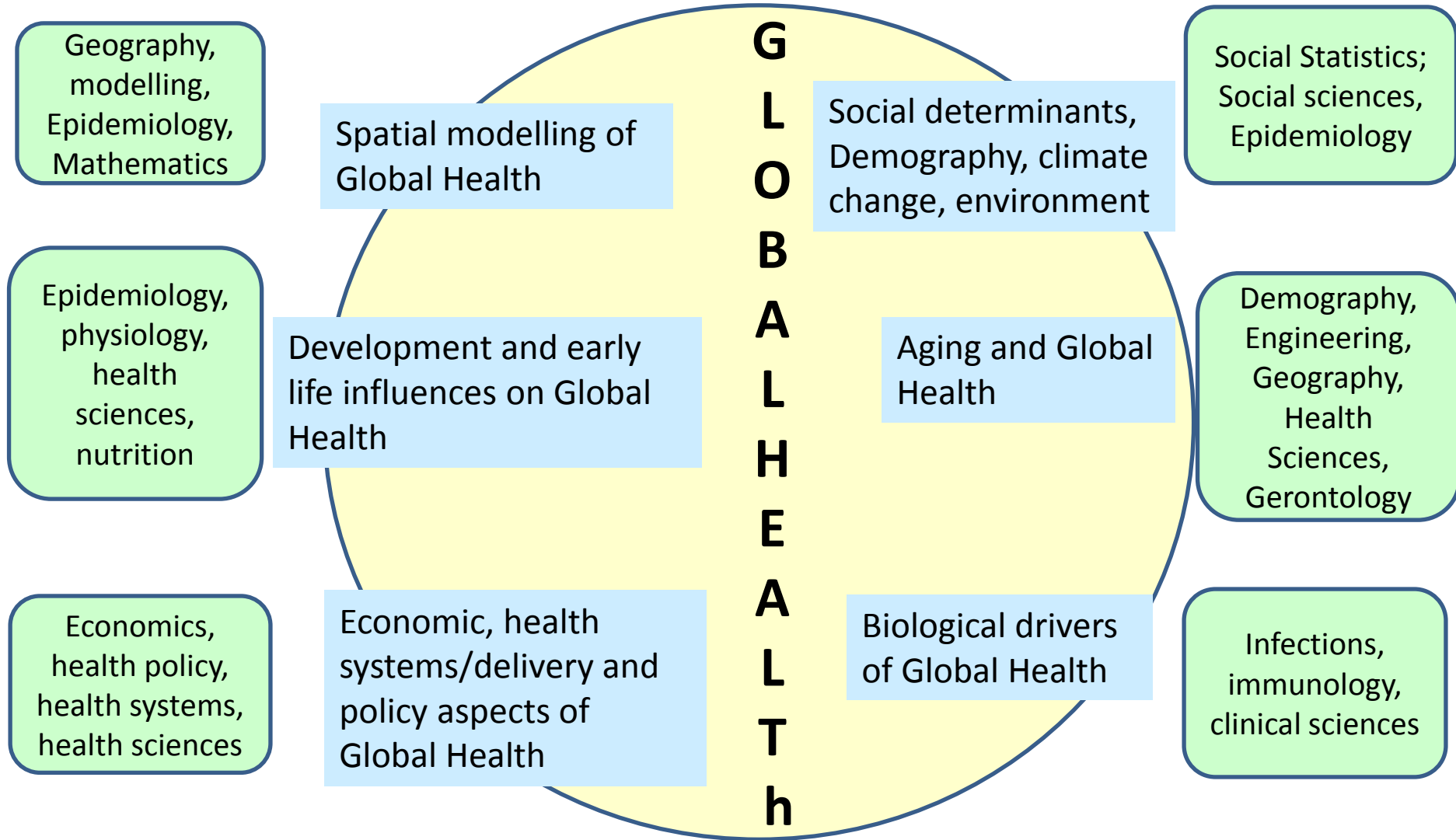
- Promotes and enhances health, human development and quality of life across populations globally
