

Early career researcher sequencing grant application rules:

1. Applicant must be an early career researcher (less than 4 years post-*viva* on 17th May 2017);
2. Applications must be 100 words or less, plus a project title, and be sent by Wednesday 3rd May to binggs@soton.ac.uk;
3. Ethical approval (if required) must be in place on application;
4. All funds (maximum £2,000) must be spent on nucleic acid sample preparation and the generation of next-generation sequence data (of any species);
5. ECR applicant must lead the project although others may be involved in the project;
6. Applicants may only submit one project;
7. Shortlisted applicants will be required to give a short presentation on 17th May prior to final decision;
8. Successful applicant will present work in 2018 NGS Symposium;
9. Decision of judges is final.
