Prior to commencement of a course you will be required to complete an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) form, formally known as a Criminal Records Bureau check which the University will arrange. On receipt of this, any declaration of criminal record – self declared or reported by the DBS – is likely to be discussed in confidence by a representative of the University and the NHS; a satisfactory outcome of any such discussions is essential prior to students commencing their course.

The requirement to declare any criminal record is mandatory, making a false or inaccurate statement will be treated as misconduct and/or an act of dishonesty. Applicants who fail to make a declaration will not be offered a place on any of our courses.
