Written communication

- Essays, dissertations, project reports
- Secretary of a student society
- Articles for student newspaper or blog
- Publicity materials for voluntary organisation
- Letter to raise sponsorship for an event

Planning and organisation

- Managing and prioritising your personal workload
- Project work
- Revision timetable
- Organising sporting, social or charity events
- Arranging travel itinerary
- STEP placement

Adaptability and flexibility

- Year abroad/independent travel
- Working part-time while studying
- Successfully changing courses
- Combining study with family commitments
- Shift working at short notice

Teamwork

- Opting for group project work
- Duke of Edinburgh award
- Team sports/outdoor pursuits

Problem solving

- Creative solutions to coursework problems
- Leisure activities such as chess, logic games, computing, role-playing
- Overcoming obstacles to achieve an ambition

Interpersonal communication

- Work experience e.g. market research, telesales, bar work
- Course or hall rep
- Students' Union work
- Nightline
- Being a mentor eg in local schools

Networking

- Joining a mentoring scheme
- Attending employer events/fairs and asking questions
- Making speculative approaches for work experience and advice

Initiative

- Suggesting changes to your course as a student rep
- Getting relevant work experience
- Starting your own business eg through Fish on Toast
- Creating a website
- Coping well in a sudden crisis
- Volunteering experience

Numeracy

- Treasurer of a student club
- Work experience in a job using numbers
- Reading financial press especially tracking a company or industry that interests you

Computer literacy

- Word processing reports/essays
- Producing graphs on spreadsheets
- Part-time course
- Designing a web page
- Using Power Point
