Antibiotic Use

- EU review of veterinary medicines & medicated feeds
- O'Neill Review on AMR (May)
- Overnment response (Sept)
 - 50mg/kg reduction target by 2018
 - Sector-specific targets to be agreed by 2017
 - Cross Government working
 - UN General Assembly meeting (Sept)

• Pig industry vulnerable due to lack of use data



Early pig sector actions

- Red tractor requirement for annual collation from 2014
- NPA allied industry in-feed medication recording
- Cross sector working through RUMA
- Pig Health and Welfare Council AB sub-group
- Close working with VMD and APHA
- Pig industry medicines hub Electronic recording
- NPA Antibiotic Stewardship Programme

NPA Pig Industry Antibiotic Stewardship Programme

Striving to minimise the use of antibiotics in the pig sector, consistent with responsible human and food-animal medicine.

May 2016



- Promotes on farm electronic recording of antibiotic use
- Allows benchmarking and collation
- Realistic data to set sensible targets
- Endorses PVS prescribing principles
- Compliance through Red Tractor







• Data for less than 20% of the finished pigs for 2015 & 2016 so far Need a robust baseline to set
 sensible targets Some vets and producers still not
 convinced – wait for legislation Need retailers to work with us



Meeting the issues head on



- NPA Producer Group and AHDB Board leadership
- RT consultation proposals
- Working proactively to change behaviour
- Positive practical case studies
- Asking retailers and processors to apply pressure but stick with eMB
- Working with vets to prevent knee jerk reactions!



Good progress already

UK VARSS 2016 report

- Overall 10%reduction in sales of across all species (62 – 56mg/PCU)
- Pig only product sales down by 24% (16T)
- Sales of CIAs remain low as does resistance
- Colistin use is at 0.12mg/PCU - lower than EMA recommended minimum of 1mg/PCU
- Next year will be even better!



The mg/PCU for products only authorised for use in pigs and/or poultry decreased by 16% between 2014 and 2015, from 192 mg/PCU to 162 mg/PCU.
