

My visit to the MRI scanner: looking inside my head

I am going to go to the hospital for a brain scan.
A special camera called an MRI is going to take pictures of my brain.

The radiographer will ask me to lie down on the bed on my back with my head resting on something that looks like a space helmet.

The bed will move up and down and will slide into the tunnel.

My mum or dad can sit next to me.

My mum or dad can put a hand on my foot. I know they are there.



I can see my mum or dad through the mirror in the space helmet.



The MRI can be a little noisy, but the radiographer will give me hear plugs and headphones.

I can listen to music or watch a video for some of the scans.


The radiographer will tell me when the music or the video will be turned on.



It is important to stay very still during the scan. I can pretend I am playing "Freeze Tag" with my friends and I can't move. This will be a little hard, but I will try my best.

There will be 12 different scans.

	Some scans are very short, others will be longer.
	The radiographer will talk to me via a microphone and tell me how long each one will be.
	If I need a break or feel I can't stay still I can tell the radiographer.
