


FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST.

The sender of a parcel for any place abroad must fill up a Customs Declaration on a form provided for the purpose. There are two forms in use, one an adhesive form, to be used in connection with parcels for all British possessions and a few foreign countries, and the other a non-adhesive form, to be used for parcels for all other places abroad.

Broken amounts, excluding halfpence, may be made up by the use of 3 Postage Stamps, not exceeding 5d. in value, affixed to the face of any one Postal Order.

MONEY ORDERS.

Not exceeding £3, 4d.; £10, 6d.; and 2d. for each additional £10 to limit £40.

PRINTED PAPER RATE.

Not exceeding 1 oz.	½d.

Limit of size, 24×12×12 in.

Early posting necessary.

We walked out to Gaba Tepe & along to Anzac Cove where we had a picnic lunch. Then we followed the line of the Australian advance, noting each line of trenches as they fought for the land foot by foot in 1915. Shells, bullets, equipment, run jaws & this litter the ground. Our men are very buried in decent caskets but there come across shells & bones of tanks. Got back to Maitos at 6:0 PM. after a long but interesting day. Walked about 17 miles!

Sunday, March 18
Chamak.

5th S. in Lent.

It blew hard all day, which is depressing as we wait be able to ammunition ship to-morrow unless it eases off - & this will postpone the "Robin Hood" performances.

After tea we had a rehearsal in the Seamen's Reading Room of the picture, & showed the 2nd part after supper. Just the band & Committee were present. It was marvellous & I loved it as much as the first time in Hollywood. Henry our new Marine Subalter played the music on the Piano, so that all the band could see the picture.

as it was blowing quite hard.

The Postman was going to Golspie
for the mail, so I got Paussey to
look out for my day or & went in
the Picket Boat - leaving the cutter.

Took 2 hrs. getting in & had to walk
ashore. Edwina, who had just arrived
& Tony Camb met me. Had about an
hour ashore & up at the Castle then
started to sail back in the cutter. We
becalmed. Then the P.B met us & towed us.
Then a gale sprung up again.

Settled some trouble at the station about despatching films & took "Safety Last" to Strattpoffer with me. During lunch Martin returned for the 'lead' which I had forgotten. Got into difficulties over 4-winding but otherwise gave a very successful show at the hotel.

Had to catch the 10.0 PM boat back as I only heard then that there would be a boat in the morning after all.

Monday, September 17
at Sea & off Dunolin.

Sailed about 9:0 AM & carried
out Sub-calibre firing.

Anchored in our usual billet
7 miles off Dunolin during the
dog watches.

Proceeded to sea for night-

Thursday, September 20

 Monday, September 24th, 1918
 At Sea + Duncolin.

Everything went off perfectly & we would easily have retained the Turret Loading Shield if the temporary Nos of the Right gun I hadn't made his intercepter too soon, causing us to fire a broadside. Saturday, October 13

I looked out for MacLean to-day, while he went ashore to play hockey for the ship. He promised to be back by 4.15 but was an hour late & I had to run up the whole way there & back to see my Foxlemen playing the torpedomen - a tie (one all).

In return Mr. Knott & I landed at Balbain in a skiff & motored to Cromarty House in a hired car from Dingwall. We dined with the Ross's & after dinner danced reels to the gramophone & sang songs. Admiral Fisher had promised to send his band for us at 11.30 PM but of course it did not turn up & after many adventures we reluctantly woke up an old

Sunday, October 14

20th S. after Trinity. 3

The divers volunteered to dive for the lost box of films & started operations at 8.0 A.M. A young A.B. of mine (name Edgcumbe) had volunteered to fetch the box off last night & a friend in helping him into the drifter had dropped the box over the side. It was a brand new copy of "The Silent Voice" & its next 6 months rental 1 night early £1000 or more! Luckily they recovered the box after 2 hours diving & after being below water for 15 hours. 18 officers helped to hang out the film (6200 ft) in the reading room to dry & so saved it.


