ment and the people of Canada were pledged to spare no effort
to win the war.

INDIA

The history of India began in the dawn of Time, and there exists archaeological evidence of a civilization dating back to hundreds of years B.C. The official entry of India into the British Empire dates from 1858, when the governing power was transferred from the East India Company to the Crown.

Queen Victoria was proclaimed Empress of India, May 1st, 1876.

The first National Government, composed of all Indian members, was established in August, 1946, when Mr. Jawaharlal Nehru formed the Interim Government, with himself as Vice-President. When the Muslim League Party joined the Interim Government in October, 1946, it became an all-party administration. The Interim Government, technically still responsible to the Governor-General who, in theory, presided over it, continued till August 15, 1947, when under the Indian Independence Act, passed by Parliament in July, 1947, the Republic of India and the Dominion of Pakistan came into being. The Indian Republic is a member of the British Commonwealth.

India was declared a Republic on January 26th, 1950. From that date, under her constitution, the head of the State is a President.

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PAKISTAN

The seeds of a Muslim nation were sown in India by the Great Mogul Emperors Baber, Akbar, Shah Jehan, a dynasty that built a mighty Muslim empire and imprinted in history an era of glorious and imperishable Muslim prowess and culture. Pakistan, though it took a little over two centuries to fructify, emerged from the ashes of this bygone era on the 14th August, 1947, when the British partitioned their Indian Empire into two sovereign Dominions.

It is an ancient land and one of the cradles of civilization. The remains of Mohenjodaro and Harappa, which archaeologists place at 3000 B.C. reveal the existence of an advanced and flourishing culture. The territory which now constitutes West Pakistan was the first homeland of the ancient Aryans in the Indo-Pakistan Peninsula. It has seen the Macedonian legions of Alexander come and go. In their heyday, Arabs, Persians, Turks and Afghans came and settled here. One Civilization after another flourished in this land and with passage of time decayed. Their contributions form the rich heritage of Pakistan.

Under the wise leadership and guidance of the Quaid-i-Azam (The Great Leader) Mohammed Ali Jinnah, the Creator and Architect of the State, Pakistan stands for democracy and the renaissance of Muslim Glory, Life and Culture.

Pakistan has an area of 364,737 sq. miles and a population of 81·54 million. It ranks as the largest Muslim State in the world and continues to be a member of the British Commonwealth.

Pakistan, which has two Provinces—East and West, became a Republic within the Commonwealth on the 23rd March, 1956, and is known as the Islamic Republic of Pakistan. It is governed by a Constitution, which is Federal in character. This Constitution guarantees equal opportunities to all citizens irrespective of caste or creed. Every citizen has a right to profess, practise and propagate his or her religion and preserve its culture, language and tradition. The fundamental rights, their enforcement by courts, independence of Judiciary, complete religious freedom and equality before the law of all citizens, Muslims and non-Muslims, are some of the important features of the Pakistan Constitution.





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

The Imperial War Graves Commission is charged with the duty of commemorating the Million Dead from all parts of the Commonwealth who fell in the Great War, and of caring for the graves, and the Memorials on which the names of those who have no known grave are inscribed, in all parts of the world; and it has accepted (under a Supplemental Charter of March, 1940), a similar responsibility for the Commonwealth's War Graves of the 1939-45 War.

The Governments of the Commonwealth co-operate through their representatives in the direct control of the work, and contribute to the cost in proportion to the number of the graves of their dead.

Enquiries as to the location of graves or memorials may be addressed to either of the Commission's offices.

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PRINTED PAPER POST may be used for written or printed matter not in the nature of a letter, and for Invoices, Bills of Lading, Circulars, Deeds and Agreements, Manuscripts for Press, Sketches and Photographic Prints, Christmas, New Year, Easter, Birthday Cards and Picture Post Cards with not more than five words for greeting. Packets must be open to inspection. Limits: $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ feet; to the Irish Republic, $2 \times 1 \times 1$ feet; not over 4 oz., 2d.; each additional 2 oz., 1d. up to 2 lb.

SAMPLES—Not over 4 oz., 2d.; every additional 2 oz., 1d. Limit, 8 oz. (No service to the Irish Republic.)

NEWSPAPERS (Registered)—2d. each copy not exceeding 6 oz. in weight; every additional 6 oz., 1d. Limits: weight, 2 lb.; size, $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ feet; to the Irish Republic, $2 \times 1 \times 1$ feet.

PARCELS—Not exceeding 2 lb., 1s. 4d.; 3 lb., 1s. 6d.; 4 lb., 1s. 9d.; 5 lb., 2s. 0d.; 6 lb., 2s. 3d.; 7 lb., 2s. 6d.; 8 lb., 2s. 9d.; 15 lb., 3s. 0d. Limits: weight, 15 lb.; length, 3½ feet; length and girth combined, 6 feet. To the Irish Republic: not exceeding 2 lb., 1s. 1d.; 5 lb., 1s. 7d.; 8 lb., 2s.; 11 lb., 2s. 3d.; 15 lb. (limit), 2s. 6d.

C.O.D.—The fees (additional to the ordinary postage) are for a trade charge of £1, 10d.; £2, 1s.; £5, 1s. 2d.; £10, 1s. 4d.; and 2d. for each additional £5 or fraction up to £40. The service does not apply to the Irish Republic in either direction.

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MONEY ORDERS—Sums not exceeding £10, 8d.; £20, 10d.; £30, 1s.; £40, 1s. 2d.; £50 (limit), 1s. 4d.

TELEGRAPH MONEY ORDERS—Same rate as for Ordinary Inland Money Orders, plus 3s. 3d. (Eire, 3s. 9d.), + 3d. per word if private message also included.

POSTAL ORDERS—Poundage: 6d. and 1s., 1½d.; 1s. 6d. to 5s., 2d.; 6s. to 21s., 3d.; 40s., 6d.

REGISTRATION FEE (in addition to ordinary postage)—1s. (minimum), (compensation up to £10); then by 1d. steps to a maximum of 2s. 2d. according to amount to be covered. An advice to sender on delivery of packet may be obtained for additional charge of 3d.

POSTAL INFORMATION (Continued)

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LETTERS AND POST CARDS—To all countries in the British Commonwealth, territories under British Trusteeship, British Post Offices in Morocco and the Persian Gulf; also to the U.S.A., Burma, Egypt, Israel and Jordan. *Letters*—not over 1 oz., 2½d.; each additional 1 oz., 1d. *Post Cards*, 2d. To all other places abroad—*Letters*—not over 1 oz., 4d.; each additional oz., 2½d. *Post Cards*—2½d.

PRINTED PAPERS (Newspapers, Periodicals, Books, Pamphlets, Music and Maps)—Not over 2 oz., 1d., each additional 2 oz., ½d. For classifications other than those defined above—Not over 2 oz., 1½d.; each additional oz., ½d.

COMMERCIAL PAPERS (Manuscripts, Deeds, etc.)—First 12 oz., 4d.; each additional 2 oz., ½d. (minimum charge, 4d.).

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MONEY ORDERS—£1, 6d.; £2, 1s.; £3, 1s. 6d.; and 3d. each additional £1 up to £40.

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
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
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
